◇ University overview

① Characteristics and history

Beginning in 1876 as Kyoto Prefectural Normal School, the Kyoto University of Education has been endowed years of history and tradition.

Although with 148 a college for teacher training, it is a comprehensive educational university with thirteen undergraduate departments, including Educational Science, Japanese Language, Social Studies, Science Education, Art Education, Music Education, and Physical Education. As a graduate school, the United Graduate School of Professional Teacher Development is established, in which 10 universities in Kyoto are united to train highly qualified teachers.

The campus is the south of Kyoto City, a city that not only represents, as the old capital, Japanese traditional culture with its many World Heritage sites, cultural assets and rich spiritual culture, but also Japanese modern culture, with its famous Kyoto Station and Manga Museum—a city in which one can experience both historical and contemporary Japanese culture.

◇ Outline and characteristics of the course for Teacher Training Students

① Characteristics of the program

Students receive attentive guidance from an academic advisor. Instruction is given in a small group. A Japanese tutor supports a student personally.

② Number of students to be accepted: 10 students

③ Period of scholarship October 2025 – March 2027

④ Requirement for program completion

A certificate of completion will be awarded to those who met the requirements below.

- Enrollment of 10 hours or more classes per week. Classes should be selected among regular subjects of KUE and classes for international students.

- Submission and publication of research paper on school education (Language: Japanese or English). Preparation of the paper should be conducted under the supervision of the academic advisor.

⑤ Outline of the course

One and Half Year Course

Those who already have a sufficient Japanese language ability may proceed directly to specialized training, without attending the intensive language course. Japanese classes are also available at KUE.

One Year Course

One-year specialized training after the half-a-year intensive Japanese language course completed. Japanese classes are also available at KUE and you can continue learning Japanese.

⑤ Outline of the course

●Intensive Japanese Language Training

The students who need to learn Japanese Language are to attend the intensive Japanese Language course at Kyoto University for 6 months. Japanese Language classes are also available at KUE after the course .

●Specialized training

Under the guidance of an academic advisor, students conduct a research project. They also attend regular classes at KUE with permission of the professors.

●Field Trip and Exchange Programs

Students may participate a field trip once a year with Japanese students. You can also visit local schools and enhance intercultural understanding with Japanese children through PICNIK program convened by Kyoto City International Foundation.

◇ Accommodations

Upon first arriving in Japan, as a general rule, students are accommodated at the Mukaijima Student Center.

○ Type of rooms: and monthly rent (As of October 2024)

single rooms (32,000JPY/month)

family room (67,000JPY/month)

1-month's rent is required as a deposit when

moving in this center. The deposit is refunded in principle when moving out. A contract with a guarantee company is required when moving in. (Approx.15,000JPY/year).

○ Facilities: Each room is equipped with an air-conditioner/heater unit, a hot water system, a bath and toilet, curtains and basic furnishings. Bedding can be rented as needed. (Approx.19,800JPY/year)

○ Information for daily life:

A shopping mall, a hospital, a park and a library are close to the accommodations.

It takes about 30 minutes to the Kyoto University of Education campus, and about 40 minutes to the center of the city by train.

Upon completing Japan Language courses, if room is available, it is possible to live in the university's International House, which are located about 15 minutes walking distance from the campus. It is also near the supermarket and in the convenient environment.
